Less is known about fluency of reading but non-fluent readers can't read efficiently. This affects comprehension, the motivation to read, and the ability to keep up with grade-level peers.

- Test instruments to identify reading fluency disorders
- An error analysis of reading samples and practice describing types of errors
- A treatment plan for a student with a fluency disorder and one for a student with double deficit
